New Water Tower Project is complete!





Kindred's first water tower was constructed in 1920. Seeing the need to replace aging infrastructure and increase water storage for a community on the grow, the City began the new water tower project in 2016. Finally, after all the hurdles and obstacles have been cleared, the project is nearing substantial completion!! On September 4th, 2019, the demolition crew made quick work of cutting, lowering, and hauling away the water tower in pieces, taking just under 7 hours to complete the demolition. Changing the Kindred skyline once again, Moore Engineering was on-site and was able to capture an amazing time-lapse video of the entire event. Water Meter Upgrades

In August, City Council approved upgrading the City's water meter system with Automatic Meter Reading (AMR) technology, specifically drive-by metering. This resource-saving metering solution allows water meter data to be collected instantly on-the-go. After installing the reading device and software in a city vehicle, our meter reading staff can quickly obtain accurate meter readings simply by driving through town. Some homes already have a newer style meter that will only require a radio device to be wired to the existing meter. Homes with older meters will receive a complete meter replacement with one that has the radio unit built into the meter itself.

No meter costs will be incurred to homeowners with this upgrade. The City has contracted with Ferguson Waterworks and Skooters Plumbing to install the meter upgrades. They will be sending notices and scheduling appointments with each homeowner for the upgrades. Appointments will be available for evenings and weekends through October 11, 2019.


How does ACH Auto Pay work?

On the 15th of each month, the total amount due on your utility bill account will be withdrawn automatically from your checking or savings account as an electronic debit. Partial payments are not acceptable with ACH withdrawals. Any resident or business that receives a City of Kindred utility bill can sign up for this FREE SERVICE WITH NO FEES!!

To enroll, simply complete the enclosed ACH registration form and return it with a voided check to: Kindred City Hall, 31 5th Ave N, Kindred, ND 58051.

Recycling Reminders

Remember that recycling pick up is every other Tuesday.



Your single sort recycling tote is a great way to help our environment when it is used correctly!

NO plastic bags or wrapping! They may be efficient in gathering items, but they cause trouble for the recycling equipment. Some grocery stores have a bin for recycling clean and dry plastic bags and wrapping.

Be sure to keep items CLEAN & DRY! Rinse containers out to remove food debris and keep the recycling tote lids closed on rainy/snowy days! Wet, soggy items cannot be recycled and will end up in the landfill. See the enclosed flyer for a list of items that are allowed and those that are not allowed in your recycle bin. Yard Waste

The yard waste dumpsters will be available through the fall season! They are located on Elm Street west of the railroad tracks by the City Shop.

RULES OF USE:

This service is for use by City residents only.

Acceptable yard waste includes:

Grass clippings, leaves, garden vegetation, brush limbs, and small branches.

NO branches larger than 6" diameter. NO tree stumps.

NO plastic bags. Please empty contents from bags and dispose of the bags in receptacle or reuse them! If the dumpsters are full, please DO NOT leave yard waste on the ground. Please check back the following day, as we monitor these daily and request empty dumpsters as needed.

Most Common Contaminants

Keep these common contaminants OUT of your recycling bin.



NO Recyclables in Plastic Bags

Empty loose recyclables in bin but leave the plastic bag out



NO Food & liquids

Compost instead! Otherwise, it belongs in the trash.



NO Electronics & Small Appliances

Donate if in good condition, or schedule a bulky item pickup, if available. Check **earth911.com** for a local drop off site.



NO Textiles, Bedding, Rugs & Carpet

Donate these items if they are in good condition, Large quantities may require special disposal.



NO Hoses, Holiday Lights, Hangers & Extension Cords

They wrap around equipment and can shut down an entire facility! They all go in the trash.



NO Plastic Bags, Film/ Sheeting & Flexible Film Packaging

Take plastic bags back to a local grocer to keep bags clean and dry, and prevent them from shutting down recycling facilities. Visit plasticfilmrecycling.org to find a drop off location near you.



NO Paper Napkins, Plates, Cups & Tissues

Compost if possible, and remember to recycle the cardboard tube.



NO Polystyrene Foam

Foam and plastic to-go containers are not recyclable curbside. Find drop off programs for items like foam packing peanuts at earth911.com,



NO Tires, Auto Parts & Scrap Metal

(Not in recycling or trash) Can damage equipment & are safety hazards. Contact local scrap recyclers or retail tire stores for recycling options, or check earth911.com for a drop off center near you.



NO Concrete, Wood & Construction Debris

Can damage equipment & are safety hazards. You may be able to schedule a bulky item pickup – otherwise throw it in the trash or order a roll off bin by contacting Waste Management Customer Service.



NO Yard Waste & Wood

Compost or put in your yard waste cart, if available. Otherwise, it belongs in the trash.



NO Non-Recyclable Plastic

Not everything that is plastic is recyclable! Recycle only food & beverage bottles, jugs and tubs.

Permit FAQ

When do I need a permit?

Permits are required for any structural changes, repairs, or additions, decks, porches, finishing basements, installing wood stoves or masonry fireplaces, window replacements of larger sizes, demolition work, accessory structures, new roofs, and fences.

A permit is NOT needed to:

Paint a house (interior or exterior), add/replace siding or insulation to an existing structure, hang wallpaper, replace cabinets, shingle a roof, or erect an accessory structure having a floor area of 120 square feet or less.

Where do I obtain a permit?

Visit Moore Engineering's Building Inspections Department inside West Fargo City Hall, 800 4th Ave. E., Suite 1, West Fargo, for all building permits EXCEPT fence permits.
