


# CITY OF KINDRED





## Water Tower Project Update

If you've noticed a change in Kindred's skyline lately, you might be seeing double.



After finally getting the project delays cleared, Maguire Iron and Moore Engineering took to the sky on December 13th, 2018. Although the project is now on hold until spring, when whether cooperates, the new tower will be prepped, painted, and put into operation. The old tower will be demolished once the new tower is fully functional. Completion is scheduled for July 2019.

#### **IMPORTANT SNOW REMOVAL RULES AND TIPS:**

- Vehicles must be removed from the roadways after any snowfall event so snow removal activities are not obstructed. Any vehicle found in violation can be towed and impounded at the owner expense and, in addition, may be punished by a fine.
- It is the responsibility of the owner and occupants of the property to <u>remove snow</u> and ice on public sidewalks within 48 hours of snowfall to avoid incurring snow removal fees from the City.
- To ensure uninterrupted mail delivery, property owners and occupants must <u>remove</u> <u>snow and ice around mailboxes</u>. Contact the Kindred Post Office on their rules and regulations for winter mail delivery.
- Moving or blowing snow onto City streets, public property, or any
  public right-of-way is NOT ALLOWED. Snow from your property
  should be moved to a place on your own property. If streets have
  already been cleared and the City has to return to clean up snow
  from your property, applicable fees could be assessed to your
  property.



- Talk to your children about safety while playing on the snow piles. Fresh snowfall creates a scurry of plows, tractors, and machines to move it all. We also know that kids get excited for the sledding and tunneling hills. Safety is always on the attentive minds of snow removal drivers but with the piles increasing in size, the ability to see children playing on/in the snow piles can be difficult. It truly is best to not play on the snow piles during the snow clean up.
- Crews aim to keep emergency routes clear while opening up other areas of town simultaneously. New city equipment has been purchased, which will help ensure snow removal is efficient and cost effective. However, Mother Nature doesn't always make things easy, so we would like to thank you for your cooperation and patience during any measurable precipitation! It is greatly appreciated!!

In August 2018, a devastating diagnosis of invasive ductal breast cancer was given to 39-year-old, Dona Schock, wife of Richard Schock, mom of Bailey (20) and Brianna (15). #### **Mayoral Update**

Hello City of Kindred and Happy New Year! A lot has happened since our last city newsletter. If your family is as busy as mine you're probably wondering how winter is already here. Let's hope Spring comes as quickly. A bright spot in the busyness is that much work has been done over the last 6 months to progress our wonderful town. Here's a quick recap on what your city leaders are up to:

- ♦ **New City Council Member:** Congratulations to Ozzie Peraza for earning the 4<sup>th</sup> and final City Council position. We're excited to work with you and look forward to the passion for Kindred you bring to the table.
- ♦ **Kindred Days:** Special thanks to the Kindred Community Club for putting together one of the largest Kindred Days to date. A parade, huge car show and the largest number of park vendors to attend the event made up some of the highlights. Quick note: my niece Bailey (6) who dunked me numerous times in the dunk tank is not allowed to attend next year's event. 2019 dates have already been set: Aug. 9<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup>. I highly recommend attending this special showcase of our community.
- ♦ **City Budget:** We have hired accountant, Stacey Iverson-Fett, to help clean up and organize our current bookkeeping system. Stacey's skill with budgets will be key to constructing a legible layout and helping us reach our goal of intentional saving and spending.
- ♦ Water Tower Project: Soil contamination on the new water tower site pushed the completion back a full year to the fall of 2019. However, our city engineer, Brandon Oye, worked hard to get the completion time table moved up to July of 2019. Much thanks to Brandon for answering the requests of the Council.
- ♦ Art Crawl: The Kindred Area Arts Partnership showcased local artists and crafters in October. Area businesses displayed the work of local artists and the band "Steel Union" visited our schools and put on a truly enjoyable concert at Kindred Spirits. I am amazed at the artistic abilities of our Kindred community.
- New City Snow Blower: In response to many resident requests to improve our snow removal system, we have purchased a directional, front loading snow blower which will perform better in wet snow conditions.
- ♦ **Elm Street Sidewalks:** In response to the many complaints about the poor state of our Elm Street sidewalks, the Council has decided to move forward in requiring that the sidewalks be replaced in the summer of 2019. We're looking at including the pool/Memorial Building parking lot into this project.
- Main Street Initiative: We're looking to partner with Governor Burgum's Main Street Initiative to help improve the esthetics and reception of new business to our downtown area. More to follow.
- Lagoon Expansion Funding: This is HUGE!!! Kindred was one of two cities in all of ND to receive a \$3 million federal grant to expand and improve our lagoon system. This is the equivalent of winning the city lottery. The lagoon project is a necessity and without this grant the \$4 million project would have come out of our residents' pockets. Special thanks to Brandon Oye of Moore Engineering, Senator Heitkamp's office, and councilmen Spellhaug and Amerman for bringing this \$3 million gift to our town.

#### Sidewalks

On behalf of the City Council, I want you to know that the sidewalk replacement project was not a decision we took lightly. It is never easy to tell anyone how to spend their hard-earned dollars. Please know that we are simply enforcing a sidewalk city ordinance that has always been in effect. Also, if the Elm Street sidewalk project goes well, the City will be enforcing other areas/home-owners in town to update or replace their sidewalks. Please remember that this is all in the name of safety, appeal, and value. The current estimated cost is \$27 per linear foot.

#### **Intentional Snow Removal**

As we prepare for another winter, I want be clear about our city's expectations regarding snow removal. We are a small town with conservative budgets. While we have invested in a new snow blower, please know that our resources are still limited regarding wet snow and large snowfalls. It would cost hundreds of thousands of tax payer dollars to equip the city with snow removal equipment/added workforce to timely handle every type of storm that heads our way. As city leaders, we have decided not to put an extraneous amount of resources into unique storms. If and when that wet snow gums up our road edges or when large amounts of snowfall take over a day to remove, please have grace for those working within our intentional budget.

In an effort to protect your curbs and to identify troublesome snow removal paths, we have strategically placed rod/pole reflectors throughout the city. Please do not remove said poles. We will take care of removal in the spring. The city has additional reflecting poles which can be purchased by homeowners for \$2 each. Thanks to all who are part of this group effort.

#### Fishing Pond Safety

You may have seen in the Cass County Reporter that the Kindred Park Board is discussing a partnership with the ND Fisheries Department to build a fishing pond/ice skating rink in Kindred. The ND Game and Fish Dept. has committed to fund 100% of the project! This is a service they offer to all communities in ND; what a blessing when the state says they'll cover projects that add value and activity to your community. This idea is only in the discussion phase, however, I want to address safety concerns that have been expressed by many city residents. Wonderfully, there are a ton of youngsters in our community and one of the many reasons we live in Kindred is to allow our kids to run through back yards with minimal worry of danger. As such, ND Fisheries is able include a protective fence in the project to keep youngsters from accessing the pond. This fence can be equipped with a locking function that will keep residents off the pond during thin-ice conditions. Thankfully we live in lake country and having safety measures around water is not a new conversation for many of our families, but know that we as a City will take every necessary precaution to ensure the pond is a source of activity rather than worry.
